I. Introduction

Apropos Manthan recommendations no. 73, Government of Madhya Pradesh has decided to establish a separate arrangement for "Training of Police Personnel" on Disaster Management. Disaster Management Institute (DMI) has been assigned the task to organise training programmes for different level of police personnel in Disaster management.

In FY 2011-12 Disaster Management Institute (DMI) organised 34 training programmes for Police personnel of Madhya Pradesh as per list annexed at **Annexure-I.** This year the programmes were organised under following heads:-

- 30 programmes for trainee police constables on **"Basic skills for Search & Rescue Operations"** at Four Police Training Schools for nearly 2500 constables
- 1 Programme on "Incident Response System" for senior Police Officers at DMI
- 1 programme on "Role of Police in disaster Management" for trainee DSPs at JNPA, Sagar.
- 1 " Training of Trainers " Programme for trainers of Police Training Organisations at DMI
- 1 "Sensitisation Programme on "Role of State Disaster Management Authority" for District & Divisional Commandants of State Home Guards & civil Defence

II. A. Training of Trainee Police Constables at PTS Indore, Tighra, Rewa & Umaria

DMI organised 30 programmes at four PTS of the State in FY 2011-12. The programme was conducted by DMI faculty as well as trainers of CISF & Uttaranchal Mountaineering Association. The services of three Students already trained at DMI were also taken at some places for training and conduct of mock-drills. The method of training was mostly participatory & more emphasis was given on practice& drills. The trainees were trained on following aspects of disaster response:-

II.B. Conduct of Mock-drill

On the last day of training, a mock-drill was also organised involving selected cadets on three themes as mentioned below:-

Scenario 1: <u>Rescue of victims from a village surrounded by flood water</u>

Selected trainees took part in this mock-drill. A scenario of villagers along with animals were shown trapped in flood water. The rescue team was placed some distance away from the site. The exercise organiser informed the team leader regarding the incident.

The rescue team rescued the trapped victims by showing following skills :-

- 1. Assessment of resources (personnel & equipment) required for operation
- 2. Deployment of available resources

- 3. Rescue of victims trapped in the flooded river by using **Chain method, bamboo method & Belay method**
- 4. Crossing the river by using Tyrolean Traverse method
- 5. Transportation of Injured victims by using Hammock carrying method / Firemen lift method
- 6. Technique for revival of consciousness by using Cardio-pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) method.

Scenario 2: <u>Rescue of Victims trapped in building collapse due to earthquake</u>

Selected trainees took part in this mock-drill. A scenario of victims trapped in a damage building due to earthquake followed by an incident of fire in one of the building was shown. The rescue team was placed some distance away from the site. The exercise organiser informed the team leader regarding the incident.

The rescue team rescued the trapped victims by showing following skills:-

- 1. Search of location of trapped victims by displaying the skill of **Perimeter search method** followed by **Line Search Method**.
- 2. Rescue of victims trapped in building caught in Fire by displaying the method.
- **3.** Transportation of victims by using Two hand, Three hand, reverse pick-a back, drag method, shoulder pull methods,.
- 4. Rescue of victims trapped in high rise building by displaying **Rappelling Method.**
- 5. Rescue of victims trapped in confined space by using various **crawling and toe& drag method.**
- 6. Technique for revival of consciousness by using Cardio-pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) method

Scenario 3: Initial Response by Police Force during Fire in a Locality

Selected trainees took part in this mock-drill. A scenario of fire in a locality was shown. The rescue team was placed some distance away from the site. The exercise organiser informed the team leader regarding the incident.

The rescue team rescued the trapped victims by showing following skills:-

- 1. Advice to community on loudspeaker for their protection & evacuation
- 2. Display of Fire entry techniques in buildings
- 3. Initial response for burn cases
- 4. Transportation of victims by using Two hand, Three hand, pick-a back, drag method, shoulder pull methods,.
- 5. Technique for revival of consciousness by using Cardio-pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) method

In PTS Umaria, the SP, PTS along with other officers, nearly 450 cadets & nearly 150 local community & media persons observed this mock-drill. The television channels & print media published the news prominently.



The mock-drill was followed by Certificate distribution to the cadets.

In PTS Indore, Director, DMI &SP, PTS along with other officers of the Training School and nearly 650 cadets observed this mock-drill. The mock-drill was followed by Certificate distribution to the cadets.

In PTS, Rewa, the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) displayed various response equipments used during search & rescue operations in natural & man-made disasters. The cadets were trained in Flood search & Rescue in the campus pond. On the last day a Big meal was arranged which was followed by certificate distribution.

In PTS, Tighra the mock-drills were organised during the training itself. On the last day all the cadets gathered in the field & the SP PTS distributed the certificate of participation to the cadets.

III. About Participants

The participants of the programme conducted at PTS, Rewa, Indore, Umaria & Tighra were newly recruited Police personnel. The Training team comprising of DMI faculty & Guest Faculty including CISF trainers & Uttaranchal Mountaineering Association trainers have found the trainees of all four PTS as one of the best group that they have ever trained. Some of the specific comments of the trainers are as follows:-

- 1. The level of Intelligence Quotient (I.Q) of the trainees was found extraordinary.
- 2. Their interest in learning certain skills like CPR, Rappelling, Rope knots, and transportation of victims was such that they were ready to stay in the training hall up to their dinner time. In some of the field exercise like Rappelling; the training team found it difficult to give chance to all the participants due to time constraint. Then, it was decided that those trainee, who have learned the technique; will train their fellow trainees.
- 3. They have the right kind of aptitude to work as a rescuer. While doing field exercise & drills, they promptly selected their leaders & distributed various assignments among the group. No conflict among the groups was ever seen at any of the PTS in group exercises or drills. They demonstrated the action with utmost perfection & professionalism.
- 4. Their level of participation & interaction with faculty was of high degree. Some questioned asked by the trainees surprised the training team. These questions were particularly asked on weapons of mass destruction, Chemical & Biological Agents. As such, these topics were later included in the training topic.

IV. Output of Training

- 1. All the participants are able:-
- > to perform CPR & rescue the unconscious victims.
- ➤ to transport the victims using correct procedure of transportation .
- > to disseminate warning during Flood conditions.
- ➢ to advice community for correct action during release of toxic gases.
- to take initial response for fire control, rescuing victims from fire engulfed room before arrival of Fire department.
- > to make improvised Flood rescue equipments with available items.
- to make different knots of rope & use in search & rescue operations
- to search victims in voids & debris created by various types of collapse using Line & perimeter method
- Rescuing victims in flood water using Chain method, bamboo method Belay method & Tyrolean Traverse method

- 2. The participants will be able to perform following actions after regular practice:-
 - Rappelling with the help of Rope, Harness or Come along set.
 - Crossing river using rope by Tyrolean Traverse method

In addition, the participants are aware about the aspects as detailed in the contents of the course.

V. About Course Material: Taking clue from the course on Disaster Management as specified in the course curriculum for the probationers constables and feedback taken by the officers & participants, a course material was developed in the FY 2011-12 & distributed among all the participants.

- **b.** In addition, one of the major out-come of the course was grooming of one young junior faculty of DMI & three students of disaster management as trainer during the course. They are:-
- Shri Amit Kumar Dadhich a MBA Graduate & trained at NCDC, Nagpur is Junior Faculty of DMI. He has specialised on the topic of transportation of victims & in organising mock-drills. He was with me at all PTS & done an extraordinary and excellent job as trainer.
- Ms. Lakshta Mandloi, a MBA Student in Hospital Administration at IMS, Indore was groomed as trained in CPR. She trained the participants on CPR at PTS Umaria & PTS Indore.
- Ms. Ekta Sonwane a MBA Student in Disaster Management at IMS, Indore. She has also done dissertation project at DMI on the topic of Urban Flood Management. She trained the participants on Urban Flood Management at PTS Indore.
- Mr. Aditya a MBA Student in Disaster Management at IMS, Indore. He has also done dissertation project at DMI on the topic of Urban Search & Rescue. He trained the participants on Urban Search & Rescue at PTS Indore.

VII. Recommendations

1. Practice & Drill

The police personnel due to their nature of job; has to perform initial response to almost all types of disasters. The first action after any disaster is to search the victims & rescue them. As such more emphasis was given to train them on search & rescue skills. However, it is felt that without practice at regular interval of time & drill thereof; the personnel will not be able to do the job perfectly during any emergency. As such it is recommended that following skill practice be included in regular drill of police personnel:

- Rescue of Victims using CPR Techniques
- Rappelling using Harness & rope
- Transportation of Victims
- Rope knots

A list of equipment is attached at Annexure-II. These may be procured at each PTS.

2. <u>Requirement of Trainers</u>

The services of the trainers, who have already been trained at DMI or other places in search & rescue skills, should be available with the training organization at least for 3-4 years; so that their expertise may be utilized fully. An institutional arrangement may also be worked out so that in case DMI requires their services for training; they should be made available.

3. Reward/ prizes/appreciation to the best performing Cadet

The Madhya Pradesh Police may think to institute an arrangement for reward/prizes or appreciation to some of the cadets who have been found extraordinary in performing the skills.
