## Introduction

Disasters and food insecurity are directly interconnected. Floods, hurricanes, tsunamis and other hazards destroy agricultural, livestock and fishing infrastructure, assets, inputs and production capacity. They interrupt market access, trade and food supply, reduce income, deplete savings and erode livelihoods. Drought, plant pests and diseases such as locusts and armyworms, and animal diseases like swine fever have a direct economic impact by reducing or eliminating farm production, by adversely affecting prices and trade, and by decreasing farm income. Economic crises such as soaring food prices reduce real income, force the poor to sell their assets, decrease food consumption and reduce their dietary diversity. Disasters create poverty traps that increase the prevalence of food insecurity and malnutrition
