Introduction

India is vulnerable to both natural and man made disasters. The last few decades have shown an increased frequency of disasters resulting in a large numbers of human casualties and huge economic losses. In the case of many such disasters, human and economic losses can be minimised to quite an extent even though they may not be totally preventable. In the aftermath of a major disaster/accident, a trail of misery is left in the form of injuries, death and short term and long term medical disorders among a large number of people.

Psychological effects are also caused. Equally important are “peripheral emergencies” like road, rail and air accidents, fire, drowning and stampedes that have inherent potential to convert into a **Mass Casualty Event (MCE)**. This is further compounded by the lack of adequate medical facilities both qualitatively and quantitatively all across the country. Hence, there is a concerted need for a quantum leap in the existing medical facilities and creation of new modalities based on well tested international practices.

There has been paradigm shift in government focus from rescue, relief and recovery centric approach to a planning, prevention, mitigation and preparedness driven approach. It has been realised that morbidity, mortality and long term health effects can be reduced and mitigated through prevention and preparedness measures.

To keep these issues as well sensitisation about Disaster and Disaster Management, Act, Medico-legal aspects, IRS, Bio medical Waste Management etc. in mind Disaster Management Institute has organised three days training programme on **Mass Casualty Management in Disaster Situation** for Medical officers, Government of Madhya Pradesh to cover topic.
